



Chaplain's Corner

Taken from Exodus chapter 20 in the Bible:

- 1. You shall have no other gods before me.
- 2. You shall make no idols.
- 3. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
- 4. Keep the Sabbath day holy.
- 5. Honor your father and your mother.
- 6. You shall not murder.
- 7. You shall not commit adultery.
- 8. You shall not steal.
- 9. You shall not bear false witness against you neighbor.
- 10. You shall not covet.

Since Nov. 17, 1980 these ten commandments could not be displayed in our schools. Forty years without direction. Since June 6, 1962 there has been no prayer in schools. Sixty two years of not teaching children that they can communicate with God. It wasn't only the atheists that were against having these things in public school, but there were Christian denominations wanting them to be removed!
