

Package delivery scams

Package delivery scams often spike during the holiday season, capitalizing on the excitement and anticipation surrounding online shopping. These scams are not confined to the festive season; they remain a prevalent issue, exploiting consumers' trust in delivery services and online retailers. A recent incident involving delivery company UPS underscores how these scams operate and their impact.

Package delivery scams

Victims end up paying, with nothing in return



Emails or texts claiming to be from delivery companies, notifying recipients of missed deliveries or issues that require additional information or payment. Engaging with these can lead to identity theft or financial loss.

You receive a package containing an item you never ordered, often with a message claiming it's a gift or trial offer. This tactic aims to deceive you into paying for unsolicited items or subscribing to unwanted services.

Websites that mimic legitimate retailers with attractive deals on popular products. Orders from these sites often result in low-quality counterfeit items or, in some cases, nothing at all.

Village of Stratton Fall/Winter Notice 2024

PREPAIRING FOR WINTER

- RV/Campers/Boats need removed from streets to allow for snow removal as needed
- Trim Trees: Trees must be trimmed to at least 14 feet above the surface of the street and 8 feet above sidewalks
- Alleys: Please keep alleys clear. Ten feet from center of alley into your property should be kept clear for utility companies to access. Streets and alleyways adjoining property needs to be maintained (clear of weeds or debris) by the property owner. No vehicles should be parked in alleys, except to load/unload.
- Snow or ice or other substances are not to accumulate or remain on the sidewalks. Usually within 24 hours of the latest snowfall, sidewalks should be cleared.
- Grass and clearing gardens/flowers/shrubbery: yard and/or garden waste needs to be taken to the tree
 dump; DO NOT DISCARD IN DUMPSTERS. Key can be checked out from the Village Office. At the dump:
 grass and other yard waste go in the gate to the left, tree limbs go straight forward through the gate.



REMINDERS

Dumpsters/ Trash Pick-up: If your trash item cannot fit in the dumpster with the lid closed please make other arrangements for disposal. DO NOT leave items on the ground by the dumpsters. Please bag your trash and keep the lids closed on the dumpsters to prevent animals and weather from spreading debris around our town.

Village Board Meetings take place the third Monday (or following Tuesday if the Monday is a holiday) of each month at 7pm at the Village Office building. Next Meeting Dates:
November 18, 2024; December 16, 2024; January 21, 2025; February 18, 2025; March 17, 2025. Everyone is welcome!

The Village Utility Department continues to install new radio read water meters in town. If you have recently had a new water meter installed in your home by Village employees you may be able to view your daily usage online! Contact the Village office for more information on registering to track and view your daily water usage.

The Village is working to purchase and install new playground equipment at the Village Park to replace the damaged, outdated equipment currently there. If you would like to donate your time to assist with install or give a monetary donation please contact the Village office. You can also round up your utility bill to donate with one payment. Please include a note or let the office know to apply the extra payment to the Park Fundraiser!

Dog Tags: Due January 1st every year and delinquent on January 31st 2025. Dog Tags are will be available at the Village Office for \$5.00 starting in November. Please provide proof of rabies vaccination with expiration date from your Veterinarian if the Village does not already have records.

If you have an ATV/UTV that is operated on the streets in the Village limits you need to register it annually at the Village office. To register you will need a copy of your liability insurance and \$25.00 registration fee. Information will then be given on rules and regulations for safety as well as receiving your proof of registration.



<u>Book Count update</u>: Our Books Read Challenge has ended. We had 623 Juvenile Books, and 942 Adult Books checked out of Stratton Library from October 1, 2023 – September 30, 2024. We did not surpass last year's numbers of 701 Juvenile and 1331 Adults BUT we did beat the 2021-22 counts of 401 Juvenile and 670 Adults checkouts. Thanks to all who support our Stratton Public Library. It is very much appreciated!

As I am entering all our books into the computer to update the old card system, I am finding so many names of people who have checked out books in the past. How about considering becoming a STRATTON LIBRARY READER once again? Come in and see what an amazing selection of books we have right here in Stratton.

NOTICE: Book Fines have been 5 cents per library day for years and years when you have an overdue book. Since my experience shows that the longer a book is out the more likely the chance it will get lost. SOOOOO...the new policy is the regular fee of 5 cents per library day plus an added fee of \$2.00 per book if the books are overdue by 30 calendar days. You can always drop your books and late fee in the book drop if you cannot catch me on an open day.
